All India Impact Based Weather Warning Bulletin

Weather Warnings for next 7 days is given below: (Graphics for warnings & rainfall distribution (Table 1) are given below the text:

14th **April (Day 1)**:

- **♦ Heavy rainfall (≥ 7 cm)** likely at isolated places over Assam & Meghalaya.
- Thundersquall accompanied with lightning, gusty winds (speed reaching 50 60 kmph) Odisha; with lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) & hailstorm at isolated places over Jharkhand; with lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) at isolated places over Gangetic West Bengal, Bihar, Assam & Meghalaya, Kerala & Mahe, South Interior Karnataka; with lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30 40 kmph) at isolated places over Vidarbha, Chhattisgarh, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Tamil Nadu, Puducherry & Karaikal, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema, Telangana, North Interior Karnataka; with lightning at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh and south Madhya Maharashtra.
- **\Delta Heat wave conditions** very likely in isolated pockets over West Rajasthan and Telangana.

15th April (Day 2):

- **❖ Heavy rainfall (≥ 7 cm)** likely at isolated places over Odisha and Assam & Meghalaya.
- Thundersquall accompanied with lightning, gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) & hailstorm at isolated places over Jharkhand; with lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) at isolated places over Bihar, Assam & Meghalaya, South Interior Karnataka; with lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30 40 kmph) at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Gangetic West Bengal, Kerala & Mahe, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema; with lightning at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh and Madhya Maharashtra.
- ❖ **Heat wave** likely in isolated pockets over West Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat state.
- ❖ **Hot and Humid** very likely at isolated places over Gujarat state.



16th April (Day 3):

- **❖ Heavy rainfall (≥ 7 cm)** very likely at isolated places over Odisha and Assam & Meghalaya.
- Thundersquall accompanied with lightning, gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) at isolated places over Chhattisgarh, Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, Assam & Meghalaya; with lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30 40 kmph) at isolated places over West Bengal & Sikkim, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam, Rayalaseema; with lightning at isolated places over Arunachal Pradesh and Kerala & Mahe.
- ❖ Heat wave at some places with severe Heat wave conditions likely at many places of West Rajasthan; Heat wave conditions in isolated pockets over Punjab, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat state.
- **\Display Hot and Humid** very likely at isolated places over Gujarat state.

17th April (Day 4):

- Thundersquall accompanied with lightning, gusty winds (speed reaching 40 50 kmph) at isolated places over Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha; with lightning & gusty winds (speed reaching 30 40 kmph) at isolated places over Rajasthan, West Bengal & Sikkim, Assam & Meghalaya, Nagaland, Manipur, Mizoram & Tripura, Coastal Andhra Pradesh & Yanam; with lightning at isolated places over East Uttar Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh and Kerala & Mahe.
- ❖ Heat wave at some places with severe Heat wave conditions likely at many places of West Rajasthan; Heat wave conditions in isolated pockets over Punjab, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, East Rajasthan, West Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat state.
- **\Display Hot and Humid** very likely at isolated places over Gujarat state.

18th April (Day 5):

- ❖ Heat wave at some places with severe Heat wave conditions likely at many places of West Rajasthan; Heat wave conditions in isolated pockets over East Rajasthan, Punjab, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ **Heavy rainfall/snowfall** likely at isolated places over Jammu-Kashmir-Ladakh-Gilgit-Baltistan-Muzaffarabad, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand.

19th April (Day 6):


- ❖ Heat wave at some places with severe Heat wave conditions likely in isolated pockets of West Rajasthan; Heat wave conditions in isolated pockets over East Rajasthan and West Madhya Pradesh.
- ❖ Heavy rainfall/snowfall likely at isolated places over Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand.


20th April (Day 7):












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- Action may be taken based on ORANGE AND RED COLOUR warnings.

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Impact expected and action suggested due to isolated thunderstorm with lightning/gusty winds & Hailstorm over Jharkhand on 14^{th} & 15^{th} April.

Impact expected:

- Strong wind/hail may damage plantation, horticulture and standing crops.
- Hail may injure people and cattle at open places.
- Partial damage to vulnerable structures due to strong winds.
- Minor damage to kutcha houses/walls and huts.
- Loose objects may fly.

Action suggested:

- > Stay indoors, close windows & doors and avoid travel if possible.
- Take safe shelters; do not take shelter under trees.
- > Do not lie on concrete floors and do not lean against concrete walls.
- Unplug electrical/ electronic appliances.
- Immediately get out of water bodies.
- Keep away from all the objects that conduct electricity.

Impact expected and action suggested due to Heat wave to severe heat wave conditions at West Rajasthan during 14th-19th April.

Red alert Areas

- ➤ Very high likelihood of developing heat illness and heat stroke in all ages.
- > Extreme care needed for vulnerable people.

Orange alert Areas

- ➤ High temperature & increased likelihood of heat illness symptoms in people who are either exposed to sun for a prolonged period or doing heavy work.
- ► High health concern for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- > Avoid heat exposure keep cool. Avoid dehydration.
- Drink sufficient water- even if not thirsty.
- ➤ Use ORS, homemade drinks like lassi, torani (rice water), lemon water, buttermilk, etc. to keep yourself hydrated.

Yellow alert Areas

- Moderate temperature & heat is tolerable for general public but moderate health concern likely for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases.
- Avoid heat exposure.
- Wear lightweight, light colour, loose, cotton clothes.
- Cover your head, use a cloth, hat or umbrella.



Agromet advisories for likely impact of Hailstorm / Heavy Rainfall / Gusty Winds

- ➤ In **Odisha**, **Jharkhand**, **Madhya Pradesh** and **Coastal Andhra Pradesh**, immediately shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields to avoid the adverse impact of likely hailstorm. Use hail net and hail caps to prevent mechanical damage in orchards due to hailstorms.
- ➤ In **Arunachal Pradesh**, **Meghalaya**, **Sub Himalayan West Bengal & Sikkim** and **Odisha**, immediately harvest the mature crops, fruits and vegetables and shift the harvested produce in safer places or cover the produce with tarpaulin sheets in the fields. Also make provision to drain out excess water from standing crop and vegetable fields.
- ➤ In **West Rajasthan, Gujarat, Telangana** and **North Tamil Nadu**, apply light and frequent irrigation to standing crops in the evening to protect them from heat waves.
- Provide mechanical support to horticultural crops and staking to vegetables to avoid lodging.

Livestock / Poultry / Fishery

- ➤ Keep the animals inside the shed during heavy rainfall / hailstorm and provide them balanced feed.
- > Store feed and fodder in a safe place to prevent spoilage.
- > To reduce the effect of heat wave/high temperature, cover the roof of poultry sheds with grass. Also provide clean, hygienic and plenty of drinking water to animals.
- > Construct an outlet with proper netting around the ponds to drain out excess water, thereby preventing fish from escaping in case of overflow.
